- ★ There are a variety of activities that have been created in the Seesaw community that will meet TS Gold standards. Students can also record voice responses/videos to meet standards such as expressive language, etc. For example, one activity I assigned to my students this week was to listen to the story Chicka Chicka Boom Boom then put all the letters that fell off the tree back on the Alphabet Line in order. Teachers can also create objective specific activities and upload them into Seesaw to meet TS Gold standards.
